

AFFILIATION WITH THE DISTRICT.

Iron Cove's name was derived from the iron bark trees that dominated the District, when the first settlers encountered the area. It essentially encompasses the fact that the inlet that borders, Drummoyne, Five Dock, Rozelle, Haberfield & Balmain, which encapsulates the direction the Club wanted to be known.

The Club's name "Iron Cove Tigers", was chosen for its affiliation to the area and the old Balmain Tigers Football Leagues Club & the Balmain & District Cricket Club (Tigers), now Sydney CC.

The Club also incorporates the Balmain District in its secondary name; Balmain & District Tigers.

The Committee were determined to be known as "**Tigers**" and be recognised as a Community based Club.

The "Tigers" want to get back to the local area, support local businesses and create a true Club environment for Juniors and Seniors alike.

The Club will also focus on training and playing on local grounds in the Inner West. Developing Junior talent and providing a pathway to Senior Cricket.

The Club prides itself on its core values that are our motto, being;

RESPECT-INCLUSION-COMMUNITY.

THE DISTRICT ALSO HAS A LONG HISTORY WITH OUR FIRST NATIONS PEOPLE IN THE SYDNEY DISTRICT.

The Club recognizes the Wangai people that originally inhabited the country now known as Leichhardt Municipality. The history of Aboriginal people in the Sydney, Leichhardt area is, without doubt, a hidden one. What we know today as the Sydney Municipality & Inner West Municipality, was once the area inhabited by the Wangal band of the Dharug (Eora) language group.

The "Eora people" was the name given to coastal Aborigines around Sydney - Eora means "from this place" - local Aboriginal people used this word to describe to Europeans where they came from, and in time the term became used to define Aboriginal people themselves.

Wangal country was known as wanne and it originally extended from the suburbs of Balmain and Birchgrove in the east to Silverwater and Auburn in the west.

We pay Respect to their forebears and those current peoples.

By-Law 2 of the Constitution.

IRON COVE & BALMAIN DISTRCT TIGERS CRICKET CODE OF CONDUCT

- 1. A Person or Persons must not behave in a manner detrimental to the spirit of the game of Cricket, or to bring the club or the game into disrepute.
- 2. Those Persons referred to can be either participants in the game, Spectators, Parents or Partners of Players.
- 3. That a Person or Persons must not;
- a. Assault or attempt to assault an Umpire, another player or a spectator, be it a senior or junior person.
- b. Abuse, either verbally or physically, another player, Umpire or a spectator, be it a junior or senior person or use language that is discriminative on the basis of race, gender or sexuality.
- c. Dispute, as distinct from question, an Umpires' decision or react in an obviously provocative or disapproving manner towards an Umpire, his decision, or generally following an Umpires' decision.
- d. Use crude or abusive language, or engage in any form of conduct detrimental to the spirit of the game, or likely to bring the game into disrepute.
- e. Use crude or abusive hand signals or other gestures.
- f. Abuse, mentally or physically a child under their care, by use of physical force, coercion, verbal and bullying manner.
- g. Participate in the use of Alcohol or any other substance that is detrimental to theirs or others performance, whilst playing, especially in front of Juniors under the age of 18 years.
- h. Refuse to supply his or her full name and registered address, to the local or District Cricket Association, such as a Club official, Association official or local Council officials or members of the Police Force, when required by that person who is eligible to lodge a report of an incident concerning conduct that is unbecoming of the Club or Association.
- i. The person or persons who are in breach of this code will be dealt with, firstly, by the Club Committee, and then if required by the appropriate Cricket Association under whose jurisdiction the competition is conducted.
- J. Use of electronic media to engage in actions that would be detrimental to the conduct of the game or against the spirit of Cricket or to bring the game into disrepute.

Either of these authorities will administer the appropriate penalty handed according to the severity of the Breach.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT



Even though we had a relatively trouble-free season in respects to the Covid pandemic, there were restrictions to our movements during the season. The new competition with the Churches Association meant that our A & B grades entered into a more competitive situation with the combined competition between them & the Inner West harbour teams in the seniors. Our Juniors came from our local distrct and were not affected by the senior changes as the Churches comp, did not have juniors to bring into the local comp.

Besides our Juniors are only the U8s to U10s and from what I observed are growing under the tutelage of our Secretary and new junior Co-Ordinator Sean Maguire. From all accounts they have done well, considering the growth has been from 2 teams to 7, with one team moving into the U10s. Congratulations to all those concerned with this growth in the already crowded club scene with the old Club Balmain South Sydney and the Leichhardt Wanderers being ahead of us in the number's stakes. Hopefully over the next couple of seasons we can grow our Juniors to rival those clubs.

Our Seniors started well. Our C grade team, of which I had most to do with in the season started off well in the early part of the season, but then due to injuries and other commitments started to fall behind in the winning stakes. Fielding a full team each week became a challenge and it began to show on the field. Dare I say we started competitively and had a couple of great games during the season. One especially comes to mind.

We had a fantastic game the in C grade during the season, between Leichhardt Wanderer's & the Tigers. The Wanderer's posted a seemingly unsurmountable 203. We were languishing on about 40 odd runs at 20th over when Noah Schwalger-Sachs & the Captain, Tom Rigby came to bat. They put on a truly magnificent batting performance, with Tom producing a great Captain's knock of 101. Noah contributing with a equally magic 60 odd. Its incredible that we fell short by 2 runs for the win. ending being defeated on 202. Still, that does not take away the performance of this team. Great work Tigers.

Similarly, our A & B grades did not fair to well this season. Languishing on the bottom of the table for most of the earlier part of the season, both teams suffered from injuries, family as well as other commitments, that drained them of the possibility of success, even though both teams had talented players in their sides. The likes of Nick Schartz, alex Henderson and of course the Captain of the combined team Jack Kerr. Unfortunately, at Christmas time, the committee had to make the hard decision to amalgamate both A & B grades to make a more competitive team in A grade. This did not work out as we expected. The combined team suffered the same fate as both single teams. Lack of numbers on game day.

We felt that the Competition, having moved from a two day, to a 35 over format, would have given us the opportunity in A Grade to have a full team each week. But this was not to be. A disappointment for those that turned up each week and were the core players in that team.

A high point though, for the boys in A Grade, was winning the "Spirit of Cricket Award" in the joint competition.

We will need strong recruitment during the off season will be required if we are to be able to field competitive teams for next season. I am hoping we can again put three teams on the park, but presently that looks doubtful. We started well three seasons ago withthat number of teams and faired reasonably well for two seasons. Lets hope that this situation can be turned around and we go forward into the future with strength on and off the field.

The Club will need to look towards cementing its viability by encouraging a social aspect to the club. Players coming back to the Club house, whether it be the Drummoyne Sailing Club or the local Pub. Encouraging the juniors to engage in social activities as well and of course, the Club looking into the future to having a Club house of our own.

I would like to thank my fellow committee members for supporting me during the season. Tom Rigby, the Vice-President, filled in when I wasn't available. Thanks Tom. A special thanks to our Secretary, Terry Kelly, who again holds the Club together, from Juniors to Seniors and as always, could be seen at both Junior and Senior matches during the season, encouraging and supporting the club. He is our driving force and will be hard to replace in the upcoming years.

One issue for these teams is the fact that the parents are in the main, managed and coached by persons who are not Cricket savvy. To assist them at training days, we did engage a coach for kids at this age group, Hayden Flack. Hayden was the mainstay in getting the kids up and running on a Thursday training, but it will take a greater effort next season to boost the training capabilities of the club to keep those players and maintain our growth.

Therefore, coaching is the key to future success of the juniors and dare I say for the Seniors as well. With Covid-19 being rampant in the community has not fared well for the season and we look forward that we may be reasonably free to have a full season, not effected by the virus next season. We can only hope.

Recruitment will be an issue therefore for the upcoming season 2021-22 both for Juniors and Seniors. A perennial problem for all Cricket clubs. For the Club to survive it needs dedicated people to step up to the crease and look towards a long bat with the administration of the Club for it to succeed.

The Club will require strong leadership over the next few years and if successful to maintain that growth into the decade. Strong strategies with cement that growth, otherwise, Iron Cove may a short run thing.

Finally, I would like to thank my fellow committee members that have assisted me in making the club run smoothly. Mark Waugh for his continued support and being a great treasurer and sounding board. Clinton Thomas as President, for being as much as driving force in making this Club a success right from the beginning. Also I would like to congratulate Sean Maguire for his sterling efforts during the season with the Juniors. He was a worthy Club man of the season.

After an intensive pre-season of training, things were looking good coming into season 2020/21. A solid core group of players from the previous season and some veterans of the club were joined by some newcomers. The turnouts at training across the first few months was very positive.
