## **AFFILIATION WITH THE DISTRICT.**

Iron Cove's name was derived from the iron bark trees that dominated the District, when the first settlers encountered the area. It essentially encompasses the fact that the inlet that borders, Drummoyne, Five Dock, Rozelle, Haberfield & Balmain, which encapsulates the direction the Club wanted to be known.

The Club's name "Iron Cove Tigers", was chosen for its affiliation to the area and the old Balmain Tigers Football Leagues Club & the Balmain & District Cricket Club (Tigers), now Sydney CC. The Club also incorporates the Balmain District in its secondary name; Balmain & District Tigers.

The Committee were determined to be known as **"Tigers"** and be recognised as a Community based Club. The "Tigers" want to get back to the local area, support local businesses and create a true Club environment for Juniors and Seniors alike.

The Club will also focus on training and playing on local grounds in the Inner West. Developing Junior talent and providing a pathway to Senior Cricket.

What we know today as the Sydney Municipality & Inner West Municipality, was once the area inhabited by the Wangal band of the Dharug (Eora) language group.

The "Eora people" was the name given to coastal Aborigines around Sydney - Eora means "from this place" - local Aboriginal people used this word to describe to Europeans where they came from, and in time the term became used to define Aboriginal people themselves. Wangal country was known as wanne and it originally extended from the suburbs of Balmain and Birchgrove in the east to Silverwater and Auburn in the west. We pay Respect to their forebears and those current peoples.

## By-Law 2 of the Constitution.

## **IRON COVE & BALMAIN DISTRCT TIGERS CRICKET**

## CODE OF CONDUCT

1. A Person or Persons must not behave in a manner detrimental to the spirit of the game of Cricket, or to bring the club or the game into disrepute.

2. Those Persons referred to can be either participants in the game, Spectators, Parents or Partners of Players.

3. That a Person or Persons must not;

a. Assault or attempt to assault an Umpire, another player or a spectator, be it a senior or junior person.

b. Abuse, either verbally or physically, another player, Umpire or a spectator, be it a junior or senior person or use language that is discriminative on the basis of race, gender or sexuality.

c. Dispute, as distinct from question, an Umpires' decision or react in an obviously provocative or disapproving manner towards an Umpire, his decision, or generally following an Umpires' decision.

d. Use crude or abusive language, or engage in any form of conduct detrimental to the spirit of the game, or likely to bring the game into disrepute.

e. Use crude or abusive hand signals or other gestures.

f. Abuse, mentally or physically a child under their care, by use of physical force, coercion, verbal and bullying manner.

g. Participate in the use of Alcohol or any other substance that is detrimental to theirs or others performance, whilst playing, especially in front of Juniors under the age of 18 years.

h. Refuse to supply his or her full name and registered address, to the local or District Cricket Association, such as a Club official, Association official or local Council officials or members of the Police Force, when required by that person who is eligible to lodge a report of an incident concerning conduct that is unbecoming of the Club or Association.

i. The person or persons who are in breach of this code will be dealt with, firstly, by the Club Committee, and then if required by the appropriate Cricket Association under whose jurisdiction the competition is conducted.

J. Use of electronic media to engage in actions that would be detrimental to the conduct of the game or against the spirit of Cricket or to bring the game into disrepute.

Either of these authorities will administer the appropriate penalty handed according to the severity of the Breach.

Hello players, supporters and fans! After taking 12 months off official presidential duties to raise my son, I was excited to rejoin the club for season 21/22. Having ridden the 'covid wave', it was exciting to be back with a full season and welcome new sponsors and players to the club, from juniors through to seniors.

Part of the ethos of this young club is to focus on our junior cricketers. We wish to provide a pathway from juniors to seniors cricket. I am always proud to drive past a ground on a Saturday morning and see our Tiger 'cubs' in their black and gold, wearing their colours proudly! This season saw some great coaches spend time with the Tiger cubs at our training ground at Callan Park. Speaking to the parents, the coaches efforts were highly valued and the training well-received. We will be continuing to bring highly-skilled coaches to train our juniors in season 22/23. In addition to these specialised coaches recruited by club secretary Terry Kelly (thank you Tez!), parents of the Tiger cubs also provide much appreciated support and guidance to their teams throughout the season. Overall the team had 4 victories after initially struggling with player numbers - something the club is looking to address for the upcoming season. ## **SECRETARY'S REPORT 2021-22**



Our Fourth year certainly had many challenges, not only the continuation of Covid-19 but the weather patterns changed nasty and the season was pockmarked with games cancelled due to unusable grounds.

Considering our push at the begging of the season to bring back three teams, that was not to be. Covid-19 had decimated our players and many a Senior game had to be called off due to players catching the virus and needing to isolate.

B grade had a mixed season again, but looked for a time they might be finals candidates. But it was not to be due to player numbers not be realized when required.

C grade on the other hand went from strength to strength during the season. For the first time in the Club's history, reached the final against Briars. The team was very competitive on the day but fell short in batting, especially when James martin was run out. Irrespectively, the team showed great comradery during the season.

The Juniors, lost a team prior the season to the Leichhardt Wanderers, which was a pity, but the Juniors grew from 5 master blaster teams, to three Under 10 and 3 Master Blaster Teams.

One feature of the season was the drive by the juniors to have professional training for the players rather than have the coaching done by parents. The Club employed a company by the name of MYPec, who hail from Penrith, run by an ex CNSW and NSW player, Josh Lalor. Josh, provided us with two of Penrith Grade Club's 1st grade women players to do the training. it was a great success and certainly improved the performances of the players. I would like to thank Josh and Sam Arnold, one of the ladies who came down each week in providing an excellent service to the Club.

The Club's intention is to formalise this initiative with a full season of training for the Club, both teams and individuals alike. This will mean having to increase the

subscription Fee for the Club, but I am sure the players and parents alike will see the benefits of this course of action.

So, coaching is the key to future success of the juniors as well for the Seniors as we are considering specialized assistance for them as well.

The Club will also embark on initiatives to provide more services for the juniors and Seniors alike.

One feature for the Club moving forward is our connection to the district around the Inner West especially the area that gives us our name. Iron Cove. Waterfront Callan Park, is and has been since our inception over Five Years ago an important ground for our Junior and Senior Teams to operate from & from where we can play the sport.

Over the past four years we have used the nets at Waterfront, but restricted to one net on a Thursday. This has not been conducive to allowing our Juniors and Seniors to practice and learn the sport. Over 50% of our players both Senior and Junior, live in the Inner West Council LGA. We feel that a fresh look at our usage of the ground will increase this coming season from our approaches to Council.

Covid-19 is still rampant in the community and we hope that it will not impact us as badly as it did this season.

The weather also bore a significant effect on the cricket season and it is predicted that it will occur again this coming season.

Ass I reported last season's report;

"Recruitment will be an issue therefore for the upcoming season 2021-22 both for Juniors and Seniors. A perennial problem for all Cricket clubs. For the Club to survive it needs dedicated people to step up to the crease and look towards a long bat with the administration of the Club for it to succeed. "

"The Club will require strong leadership over the next few years and if successful to maintain that growth into the decade. Strong strategies with cement that growth, otherwise, Iron Cove may a short run thing."

Finally, I would like to thank my fellow committee members that have assisted me in making the club run smoothly. Alex Saad as President, Warwick King Vice-President, James Cochrane-Burgess as Club Captain.

Special mention to an old friend over the years in Cricket, Mark Waugh, who is moving to France for the next few years. Mark has been our treasurer in the new Club and supported us in our endeavors. Mark has been a great friend to the Tigers and was instrumental in helping me bring about the new Club. I and the Club wish him well, but look forward to seeing him again in a few years.

One person the Club saw as assisting in driving the Club into the future, is Andrew Ferguson, is also leaving us to move to Melbourne. Andrew was the recipient of the coveted Senior "*Spirit of Sportsmanship*" award for the season. Not only for his work in Captaining B Grade from time to time, but for also forming an U10 team. That team had within the players Andrew Symonds Son, William Symonds.

Also, I would like to thank two ladies that helped drive the Juniors this season. Carolyn Maguire, who I have to say, kept me on my toes, as well as Laura Vidmar, who has suffered a great tragedy in her life as ex-husband and Australian legend Andrew Symonds, died this year in tragic circumstances. The Club's heartful sympathies go out to her and her family. Both these ladies received the Club Person of the Year Award.

#### C Grade Report 2021/2022
